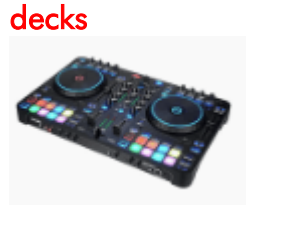


**Key Vocabulary - instruments**



**drums**  
Hollow cylinder percussion instrument sounded by being struck or beaten with sticks or the hands. Types include drum sets, hand drums, frame drums and African drums.



**decks**  
Equipment used by DJs, MCs, and Rappers to mix sounds from different records and to make effects e.g. scratching that was first used in the late 1970s.



**bass guitar**  
A string instrument which is related to the electric guitar. The bass guitar is shaped like an electric guitar, except that it is longer.

**Objectives**

**Key Vocabulary**

<b>compose</b>	Creating and developing musical ideas and 'fixing' them.
<b>improvise</b>	To make up a tune and play it on the spot. There is an assumption that it can never be recreated.
<b>perform</b>	Singing and playing instruments for others to hear.
<b>rap</b>	A vocal technique in which the performer speaks rhythmically against a steady beat.
<b>rhythm</b>	Long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.
<b>pitch</b>	High and low sounds.
<b>pulse</b>	Creating and developing musical ideas and 'fixing' them.
<b>melody</b>	Another name for tune.
