Keyboard 	An electric instrument played like the piano. It has a range of pre-recorded sounds.
drums 	Hollow cylinder percussion instrument sounded by being struck or beaten with sticks or the hands.
bass guitar 	A string instrument related to the electric guitar. Shaped like an electric guitar but longer.
Electric guitar 	It is a string instrument usually played with a pick and sometimes with the fingers using electrical signals for amplification.
saxophone 	A member of a family of metal wind instruments with a reed.
trumpet 	A brass instrument used mainly in Classical music and jazz music

Key Vocabulary	
melody	Another name for a tune.
tempo	A musical dimension that describes how fast or slowly the music is played.
pulse	The regular heartbeat of the music; its steady beat.
rhythm	Long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.
pitch	High and low sounds.
tempo	The speed of the music; fast or slow or in-between.
improvise	To make up a tune and play it on the spot. There is an assumption that it can never be recreated.
compose	Creating and developing musical ideas and 'fixing' them.
perform	Singing and playing instruments for others to hear.
audience	A group of people gathered to see or hear something.
question and answer	A musical structure where a person sings or plays a musical idea and the rest of the performers sing or play a different musical idea.
dynamics	A musical dimension indicating how loudly or quietly the music is being played.
