Heir	A person legally entitled to the property or rank of another on that person's death.
Coronation	The ceremony of crowning a king or queen.
Reign	The period of one monarch's rule.

Queen victoria



Queen Victoria was 25 years old when she became queen in 1837. She was queen for 64 years until she died at the age of 81 years old in 1901. She is currently the longest reigning monarch.

Queen Elizabeth 1



Queen Elizabeth became queen at 18 in 1558 and reigned for 45 years until she died at the age of 69 in 1603. She was the last of the Tudor family.
