Romans	Citizens of ancient Rome/the Roman Empire.	Celts	People living in Britain and some parts of Europe after the Iron Age.
Invalidate	To enter another country by force with an army.	Tribe	A group of people living together and sharing the same customs/language etc.
Conquer	Take control of another land.	Rebellion	Action by a group of people fighting against authority.
Empire	Many countries ruled by one ruler.	Impact	A strong effect – a change.

Impact

- **Language** – many of the words in the English language come from Latin (the language spoken by the Romans) – even the name Britain itself comes from the Latin word Britannia.
- **Legal system** – how we deal with the law being broken is based on the legal system established by the Romans
- **Calendar** – our calendar is based on the one created by Julius Caesar – he even named a month after himself – July
- **Roads** – the Romans built straight roads – some have been turned into motorways or main roads we use today
- **Towns** – the idea of planning and building important towns was brought by the Romans – Chester is an example that still survives
- **Clean water/drains** – the Romans built aqueducts that brought clean water and public baths and flushing toilets
