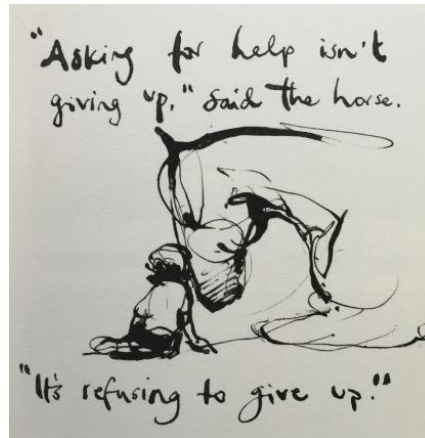




Our High Meadow Community 'Thought for the Week'

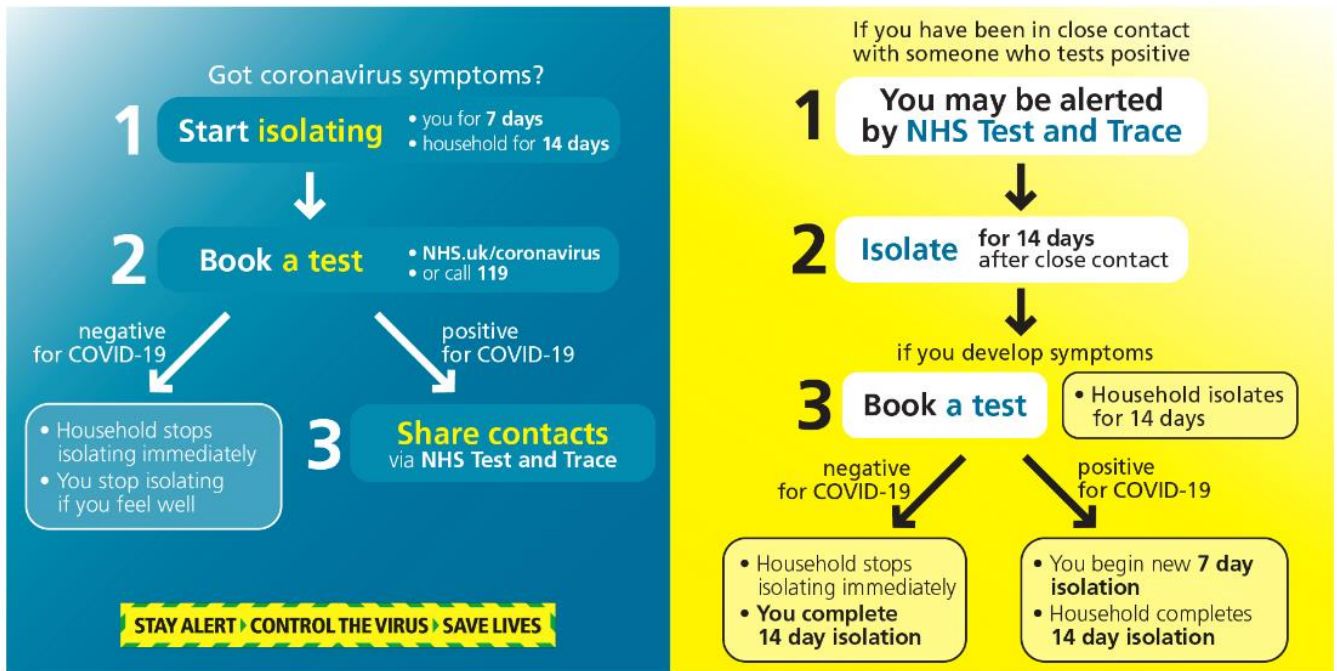

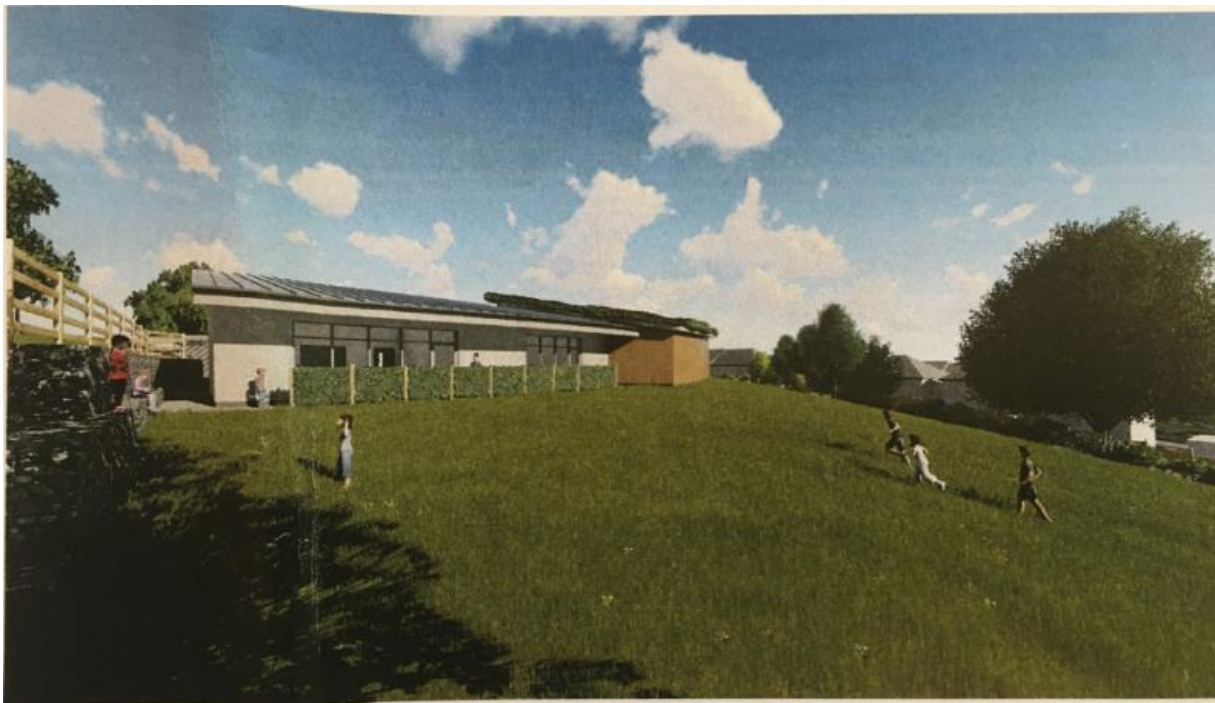
