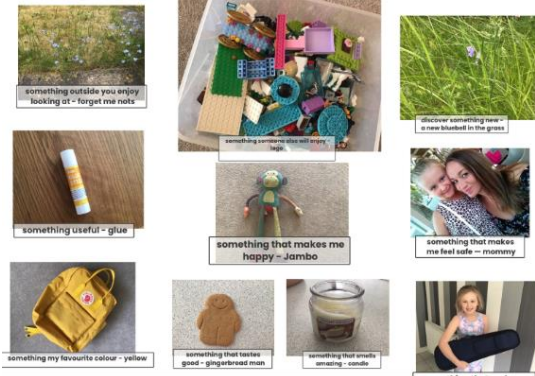
In maths this week we have been problem solving while revising place value and multiplication!

We stopped and appreciated what we are grateful for.



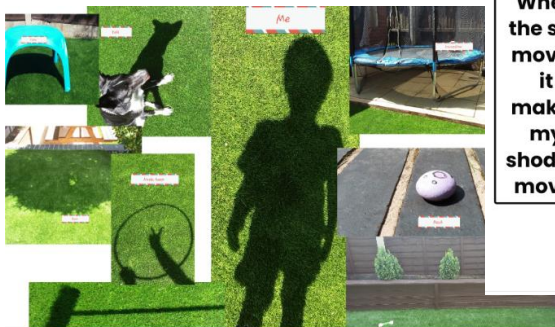
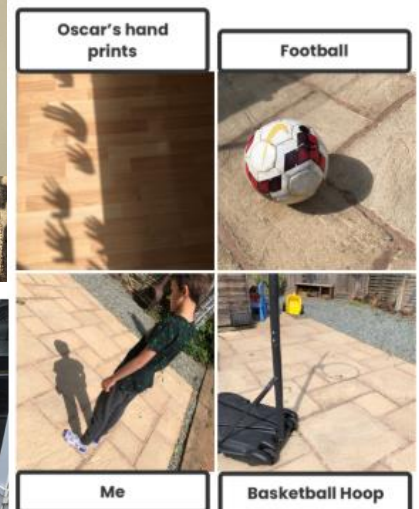
We worked on our mapping skills by creating sketch maps as part of **geography** learning.



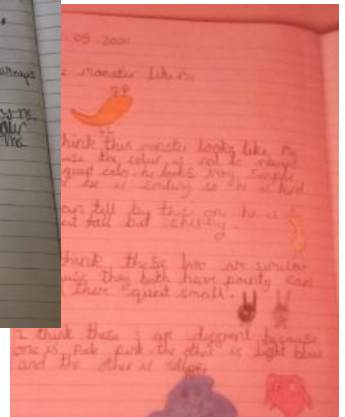
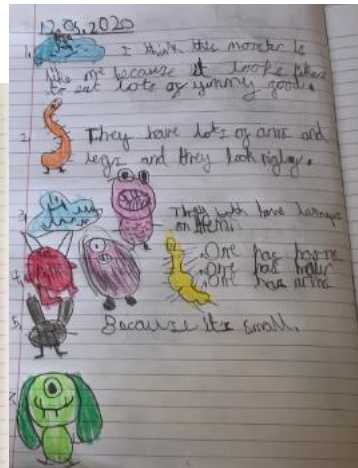
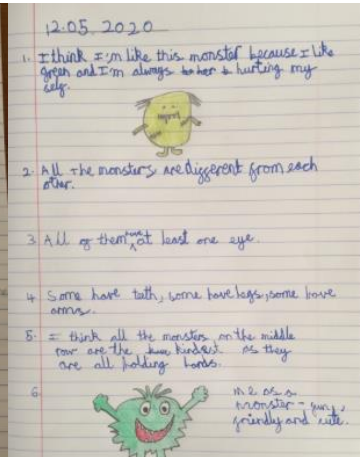
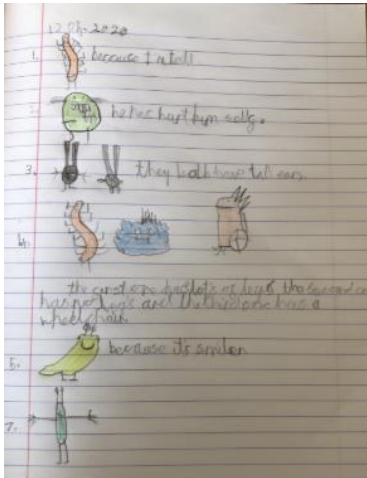
In **science** we have been investigating light and shadows.

Can you change the size of a shadow?

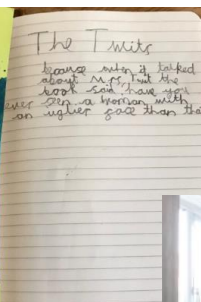
What happens if the light source is closer to the object?
