Process



Looking through images of animals and animal books.



Cut out the mask template and then stick it directly onto A3 card.



Children chose an animal image and study the main features. They pick out key shapes and draw the face directly onto the white card around the template.



Pupil finishes drawing and cuts out mask design.



Cut up the central ridge of the nose and then fold it back to create flaps.



Create flaps to attach its nose (the nose was made from a separate piece of folded card). Its then stapled to it to make a nose.



Slats are cut below the ears and at the top of the head to be pulled together and stapled to make the mask 3D.



Experiment with mixing paints and choosing colours to make their masks wholly unique and individual.



Completed mask.
